- Mostly dry weather for Australia next 10 days.
- Showers for the western Plains this weekend?
- Rains to maintain favorable conditions for palm in SE Asia.

- NORTH AMERICA: Near normal rainfall will benefit all crops through 10 days.
- SOUTH AMERICA: A brief shot of warmth will impact Argentina crop areas later this week.
- SOUTH AFRICA: Plentiful rainfall headed to most maize areas of South Africa into next week.
- EAST ASIA: Warm temperatures and sufficient soil moisture a boon for China's winter wheat crop in the next 1-2 weeks.

- On the Plains, dry weather and unusually high temperatures persist. In areas with adequate soil moisture, including much of the northern Plains, the late-season warmth is favorable for winter wheat emergence and establishment.
- In the Corn Belt, mostly dry weather accompanies record-setting high temperatures. The late-season warmth favors previously delayed corn and soybean harvest activities.

- All of the Plains...Delta...and Midwest areas are dry.
- In the short term weather models are in good agreement that a cold front is going to move through the Upper Plains and the Midwest on Wednesday night and Thursday.
